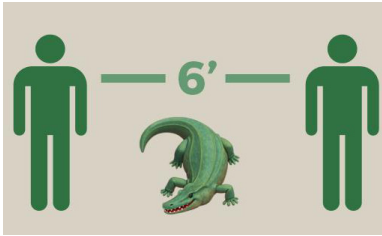

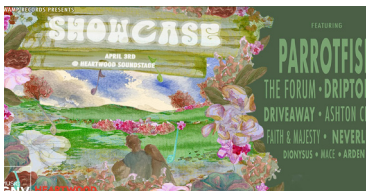

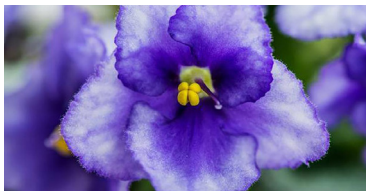
Laugh Out Loud at the Opening Weekend of Hallelujah Girls

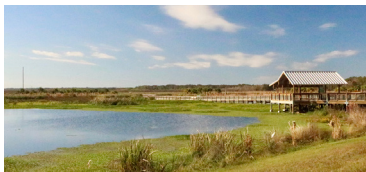
Savor a Night of Local Music at the 2021 Swamp Records Showcase
