Spot Wildlife and Learn How a Park Can Improve Water Quality on a Ranger-Led Walking Tour at Sweetwater Wetlands Park Sunday, May 7, 2:30 p.m. - 3:30 p.m. | Sweetwater Wetlands Park 325 SW Williston Rd., Gainesville, FL 32641

Sweetwater Wetlands Park consists of more than 125 acres of wetlands and ponds and improves the water quality of Paynes Prairie and the Floridan Aquifer. Recent bird sightings include Sandhill Crane, Sandpiper, Downy Woodpecker, Great Crested Flycatcher and Palm Warbler. Tours are free with park admission.

Learn about water management and wildlife found at the park. Tours last about 1 hour and include a walking portion of about 1-mile start to finish. Bring water, sunscreen and comfortable walking shoes.
